The six geese a-laying are the six **Days of Creation**, the seven songs of swimming are the **Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit**. The eight maids-a-milking are the eight **Beatitudes**.

The nine ladies dancing are the **9 Fruits of the Spirit**. The ten Lords are leaping are the **10 Commandments,** the **11** pipers piping are the **11 Faithful Apostles** and the **12** drummers drumming are the **12** points of doctrine in the **Apostles creed**.
